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The DFE and Public Health England have advised that we must ensure that any child, parent or staff member who develops symptoms relating to Covid-19 gets tested. This is essential to ensure the safety of everyone else in each class bubble. There is now legislation, as part of the Coronavirus Act 2020, which can enforce this, so from now on we are stipulating that you must agree to undergo testing if you or your child has any symptoms, and to inform us of the result.

What to do if...	Action needed	Return to school when...
<p>...my child has coronavirus symptoms</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A Persistent Cough and/or• A High Temperature and/or• Loss of taste and/or sense of smell (Anosmia)	<p>Do not come to school Contact school to immediately advise us of a possible case</p> <p>Get tested Inform school of test result Keep in regular contact with school</p>	<p>...the test comes back negative and if they feel well and no longer have symptoms similar to coronavirus (COVID-19), they can stop self-isolating and return to school.</p> <p>If no test is available, return to school after self-isolating for 10 days.</p>
<p>... my child tests positive for coronavirus</p>	<p>Do not come to school Contact school to immediately to advise of confirmed case</p> <p>Self-isolate for at least 10 days Keep in regular contact with school</p>	<p>... they feel better. They can return to school after the 10 day isolation period, even if they still have a cough or loss of sense of smell or taste (anosmia). This is because a cough or anosmia can last for several weeks once the infection has gone.</p>
<p>...somebody in my household has coronavirus symptoms</p>	<p>Do not come to school</p> <p>Self-isolate for 14 days Household member to get tested Inform school immediately of test result Keep in regular contact with school</p>	<p>... the member of the household tests negative.</p> <p>If no test is available, return to school after self-isolating for 14 days.</p>

...somebody in my household tests positive for coronavirus	Do not come to school Self-isolate for 14 days Keep in regular contact with school	...your child/children have completed 14 days isolation
...NHS Test and Trace has identified my child as a 'close contact' of somebody with symptoms or a confirmed case of coronavirus	Do not come to school Self-isolate for 14 days Keep in regular contact with school	...your child has completed 14 days isolation
...we/my child has travelled and has to self-isolate as part of a quarantine period	Do not come to school Self-isolate for 14 days Keep in regular contact with school	...the 14 days quarantine period has been completed
...we have received medical advice that my child must resume shielding	Do not come to school Keep in regular contact with school	...restrictions have been lifted and shielding is paused again
